- Associating handwriting movement with visual letter patterns and aural phonemes will help children learn to spell





What to teach in handwriting...

- Paper placement
- Posture
- Correct letter and numeral formation
- Size of letters
- Writing on a line






Handwriting at Barrow Hedges

At Barrow Hedges, we aim to teach children to write in a way that is legible, fluent and fast. This means that we have a developed a style which enables the letters to be joined easily.

Handwriting at Barrow Hedges

Foundation and KS1 Long letter ladders Letters involving longer lines up or down (i,t,l,j,u,y) One armed robot ladders Letters that bounce back up or down (r,b,m,h,n,p) Curly caterpillar ladders Letters than involve curves (a,c,d,g,o,q,r,s) Zig Zag letter ladders Letters than involve sudden corners (v,w,x,z,) One armed robot ladders Letters that bounce back up or down (r,b,m,h,n,p) Up to the sky ascenders Dig underground Descenders Down to the ground On the grass Up and down Left and right Flick Bouncing back up or down Over and curl



Cursive Writing – Top Tips!

- Children need to be able to confidently form single letters before joining.
- When writing in cursive script (joined), it is necessary to plan ahead for the upcoming letters while writing the current letter.

Five developmental phases

- Readiness for handwriting; gross and fine motor skills leading to letter formation (Foundation / 3–5 years)
- 2. Beginning to join (Key Stage 1 / 5–7 years)
- Securing the joins (Key Stage 1 and lower Key Stage 2 / 5–9 years)
- Practising speed and fluency (lower Key Stage 2 / 7– 9 years)
- Presentation skills (upper Key Stage 2 / 10–11 years)



Left-handed children

- There is no reason why left-handed children's handwriting should be any worse than that of right-handed children
 - Left-handed children should not sit to the right of right-handed children as their papers will meet in the middle!





Posture

- A good posture and pencil hold are vital for good handwriting.
- Discourage sitting on one foot, kneeling or wrapping their feet around the legs of the chair!



Left-handed children

 Left-handed children should be taught to position their paper to the left of centre and then angle the paper for comfort

Sloped surfaces

- Children who experience some motor control difficulties often benefit from writing on a slight slope
- Ring-binders are the easiest and cheapest way to provide a slope
- Commercial wooden or plastic writing slopes are also widely available





What are fine motor skills? *Directly linked to gross motor skills *Smaller actions for example picking up or grasping an object *Usually develop alongside gross motor skills






