We do want to encourage children to continue to read for pleasure and for their mental health and wellbeing so please remember that they can still access BugClub, if they wish.

Furthermore, a lot of research has gone into the impact of reading aloud to children. Reading to children supports vocabulary, comprehension, fluency, expression and progression. It's also a great excuse to have a cuddle and enjoy time together as a family.
