The Reception and Year 1 children enjoyed their Magic Shows on Wednesday afternoon and all the children enjoyed a wonderful Elf Day and we have raised approx. £1300 from this day - thank you to our hard working PTA for organising this lovely event. We have also raised £950 from our Christmas Hamper Raffle. All this money raised goes directly back into school for the benefit of the children. Thank you to parents for your support with these fundraisers. We will obviously be revisiting when our discos can be rescheduled.

At this time of year, we have a charity collection, this year our buckets were out at the KS2 singing events. Thanks to your generous contributions we are sending off approx. £280 to the Royal Marsden.

Miss Holmes, Maple Class Teacher, will be leaving us today as she is moving on to new adventures ahead – she has decided to do missionary work. Mrs Johnson will also be 'officially' leaving as a Teaching Assistant, although is continuing to do tutoring and small group work with us as part of our Pupil Premium and Recovery Funding, so we are delighted about that. I would like to extend heartfelt thanks to both for their hard work at Barrow Hedges.

I am sure you will join me in thanking all the staff for their tireless work this term. I would also like to extend a huge thank you to parents for your support and to our governors for their work and support for our school community.
