A separate communication will be sent to those parents whose children attend an externally run Wednesday or Thursday club and this will include a form to complete – please do look out for this and respond as soon as possible so that we can make the necessary arrangements. Hockey and Benchball are teacher run clubs so with regret cannot go ahead. Hedgerows will run as usual for those children who are booked on, as will tutoring.

When making any decisions to close or partially close the school, please be aware there are many factors to consider. This includes the health and safety aspects of a reduced staff capacity including adequate supervision, necessary first aid cover and the required safeguarding provision.

Finally, I absolutely recognise the disruption that this causes for parents and carers which is why we have wanted to provide you with this information at our earliest opportunity. I know that the decision the teachers have made is certainly not one that has been taken lightly, for all the reasons explained in my letter of 24th January 2023.
