Who was Samuel Pepys?	Samuel Pepys was famous for his diary. He wrote about the Great Fire of London.
What was different about how fire was put out in the 17th century?	They used water 'squirters' and buckets of water. There was no official Fire Brigade. When this didn't work, they to knock some houses down to stop the fire spreading.
What does the song "London's Burning" tell us about the past?	'London's Burning' is thought to be about the Great Fire of London.
Why was the Great Fire of London so big?	The fire spread quickly because the buildings were made of wood. The buildings were built very close together.
