





History: Explorers



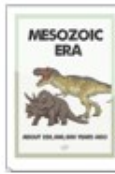
Key Vocabulary	
compass	A compass is a tool for finding direction.
discovery	Something that is found unexpectedly or during a search.
invade	To enter somewhere as an enemy, in order to take over the land.
navigate	To plan the journey of a ship.
shipwreck	An accident in which a ship is destroyed or sunk at sea.
voyage	A long journey involving travel by sea.

Key Facts	
Who was Captain Cook? 	Captain James Cook was a famous seafarer, navigator and map maker who became famous for his voyages to unknown parts of the world. Captain Cook was the first person to accurately map the Pacific Ocean.
Who was Francis Drake? 	The most famous sea adventurer and navigator from Tudor England. Sir Francis Drake became the first Englishman to travel around the globe. He was vice admiral of the English fleet (navy) at the time of the Spanish Armada.
Who was Grace Darling? 	Grace Darling is remembered for the rescue she undertook with her father in the Farne Islands in 1838.

In Year 1...

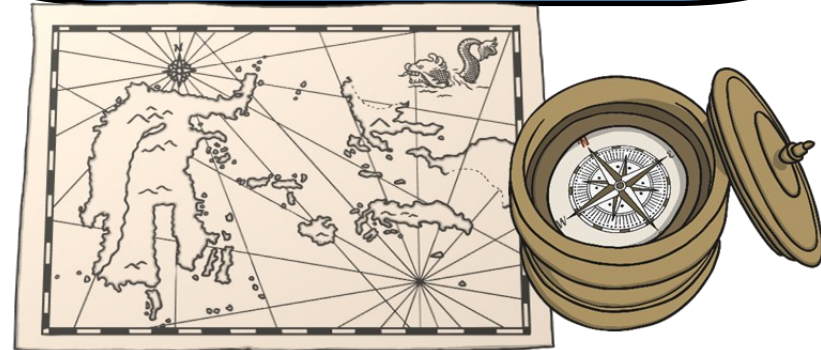
In Year 1, you learned about explorers in space.
