# **New Knowledge**

How does Christian belief influence the way they live, treat other people and the natural world?

Most Christians believe that God gave human beings a special responsibility with the world to grow it, guard it and use it wisely. This is called Stewardship.

### Why do Christians pray and read the Bible?

The reason Christians pray today is for the same reasons why people prayed in the Bible: to speak to God and ask for healing, forgiveness, and direction. Praying is how Christians grow a deeper relationship with God. The Bible also tells them how to live their lives in a way that respects God and follows his teachings.

### Why do Christians help others?

Christians believe that it is part of their duty to act in a moral way, and this involves helping others around them helping the needy.

**e.g.** the Salvation Army is a Christian denomination that provides help to those who are suffering.

#### How do people choose a role model?

A role model should be someone that you admire in all aspects of their life and leads a healthy lifestyle. Look for qualities such as passion and the ability to inspire, a clear set of values, a commitment to community, selflessness and acceptance of others and the ability to overcome obstacles.
