Children will know how to safely research a chosen subject and consider its validity. Children should be confident with the copy and paste feature




E-safety:

To understand that anyone can post content online and to be mindful of trusted sources of information.

Computing Key Vocabulary	
Desktop Publishing (DTP)	Software and hardware system designed to produce high quality print/media for users with limited or no experience in publishing or printing
Export	To save media in a format such that it can be watched, listened to or read by others without access to the editing software used in its production.
Portable Document Format (PDF)	A file format for capturing and sending electronic documents in exactly the intended format – recipients cannot alter the original document
Shortcuts	Shortcuts in computing help to speed up the process of certain tasks. By holding the Ctrl and C button, a user can copy an item in a more efficient way.
Transmedia	Content developed across multiple platforms in a variety of different media, for example a website accompanying a television series.
Word processor	A program or machine for storing, manipulating, and formatting text entered from a keyboard and providing a printout.


