Geography: Greece



Key Vocabulary	
Environment	The environment includes everything living and everything non-living that is found in a place.
Environmental regions	An area defined by having similar climate, landscape and other physical geographical features.
Human geography	Things that have been built or created by humans.
Land use	The way that land is used.
Physical feature	Anything that is on the Earth naturally.
Democracy	A system of government, typically through elected representatives.
Artefact	An object of cultural or historical interest.

Key Facts

How is land used in Greece today?

A lot of the land in Greece is used for farming. Nearly 40% of the population of Greece live in or around Athens, which means a lot of Greece is either farmland, forest or mountain.

What are some of the physical geographical features of Greece?

Greece is made up of many smaller islands, as well as a portion of land attached to mainland Europe.
